

Physical Education

Students will develop self-confidence and physical fitness during physical education. Focus will be placed on conditioning and developing large and small motor skills.

Music

Students will participate in singing class songs. They will use rhythm instruments to demonstrate tempos and rhythm. The children will listen to music and identify the instruments used. Students will also study the composer Johann Sebastian Bach.

Computer

The classroom teacher teaches basic computer skills. Time in the computer lab begins in first grade.

Library

Students will visit the school library once a week where they will listen and respond to stories from various genre. They will also learn library etiquette. Students may begin checking out books second semester.

Field Trips

Selected field trips are scheduled throughout the year to enhance the curriculum and provide enrichment opportunities.

Homework

Homework is a vital part of the learning process. Assignments are designed to extend or reinforce concepts learned in class. A homework folder will be handed out each Monday. Completed homework should be returned in the folder on Friday.

Piano Lessons

Piano lessons are offered for students Kindergarten to 8th grade. There are two piano recitals in January and May. Every spring our school also participates in the ACSI Piano Festival.

• Language Arts

Reading

- Practice phonics to sound out letters, blends, and words
- Recognize letters, words, and sounds and apply this knowledge to read simple sentences
- Use comprehension strategies to identify the basic facts and ideas in what is read, heard, or viewed
- Listen and respond to stories based on well known characters, themes, plots, and settings

Writing

4 Write words and brief sentences that are legible

Listening and Speaking

- Speak with an age-appropriate command of standard English conventions
- Listen and respond to oral communication
- Speak in clear and coherent sentences

Science

Students will use hands-on activities to explore and observe. They will differentiate between solids and liquids. Students will study the major structures of plants and animals. They will recognize that the earth is made up of land, air, and water. Students will use the scientific method to observe and investigate.

History

Students in kindergarten are introduced to basic geographic and historical connections between the world today and the world long ago. The stories of ordinary and extraordinary people introduce the concepts of courage, self-control, justice, heroism, leadership, deliberation, and individual responsibility. Emphasis is placed on civic behavior: how we interact respectfully with each other, following rules, and respecting the rights of others.

Bible

Bible is taught as a separate subject, but is also integrated into all aspects of curriculum and campus life. The children learn, through their years at Foothill, the importance of their Christian faith and the value of serving others. We want all of our students to know the Lord on a personal level so that when they leave Foothill, they will be equipped to live a discerning lifestyle that honors God.

Kindergarten students will listen and respond to important Bible stories. They will also memorize key Bible verses.

Kindergarten is demonstrating FAITH IN ACTION by collecting pennies to build water wells in Ecuador.

The Association of Christian Schools International has recognized the FAITH IN ACTION program at FCS as an exemplary program.
