Never underestimate the compassion, creativity and willpower of today's youth! Our students and teachers are learning what it means to be burdened with the things

that break the heart of the Lord. They're also looking for ways to be part of the solution. Let me share with you just a few of their endeavors from this current school year.

Our primary students have ministered to the elderly at local rest homes through correspondence and visitation. Our third graders and Junior Beta Team reached out to Skid Row's urban poor with toys distributed through Fred Jordan Mission. Fourth graders collected needed supplies for West End Animal Shelter. Working with Operation Blessing, our fifth grade students raised enough money to purchase 5 goats for a village in Bulgaria. Sixth graders, burdened for persecuted believers abroad, recently presented nearly \$700 to Open Doors in Orange County along with letters of encouragement for believers who are oppressed for their faith.

Hearing of the plight of Uganda's forgotten children, our entire junior high sponsored our first Christian Rock Concert, selling cookies, bracelets and T-shirts toward their pledge of \$10,000 this school year! Through Invisible Children's Schools for Schools program, they adopted a school in Uganda and have raised over \$6,000, surpassing USC in funds raised for this cause!


Anniversaries Celebrated

Reading Counts at FCS!

Developing skilled readers and effective writers is critical to a child's success in school and life. The value of strong reading curriculum cannot be overstated.

That's why the FCS curriculum committee, comprised of teachers and I, spent an entire year reviewing reading textbooks and language arts programs. Houghton Mifflin, a state approved publisher was adopted along with the nationally recognized Four Square Writing Method.

Reading Counts is another supplemental program that inspires children to read. Once assessed, children select



books at their independent reading level and take comprehension tests when finished. Children earn awards for reaching their grade level goals.

> Librarian, Sandi Douglas, reports the circulation statistics for last quarter indicated our students checked-out approximately 3,200 books. During that same both quarter, Baseline and Grand Avenue students read and passed the comprehension tests for over 3,500 books. With over 22,000

volumes in our library and over 5,000 Reading Counts tests, the students won't be running out of selections any time soon!
